The Basics

- Current enrollment Tk-8 is 311 (Budget is based on 340)
- 6th grade enrollment is down; elementary has waiting lists at all grade levels
- Propose adding one elementary class using students on the waiting lists to increase enrollment

How?

- Split current 3rd/4th combo class, creating two single grade level classes
 - Fill new enrollment spots with students on waiting list
- Convert MPR into classroom
 - TK/K to move there giving them move space
- New elementary class to occupy room G1


Expenses

- New Elementary Teacher
 - Long-term substitute option
 - (\$155 per day x 150 days = \$23,250)
 - Certificated teacher option
 - (Salary + CALSTRS + benefits = \$70,000)
- Convert MPR to Classroom
 - Approximately \$5,000
 - Money to be used from TK/K Grant
- Furniture for new elementary class
 - Approximately \$3,000
 - Already have many of the things we need

Proposed Timeline

- September 8th Informational Staff Meeting
- September 9th Board Meeting
- September 10-11 (weekend)) Build Wall in the MPR
- September 12 Send email home to 3rd and 4th grade families; new teacher introduction
- September 12 18 Move TK/K to MPR; Outfit G1 with tables and chairs needed for new elementary class
- September 19th Officially split 3/4 combo class. New elementary class starts in G1; TK/K in MPR.

MPR Plans



Considerations

- Our school would no longer have an MPR. We must find different homes for:
 - Certain grade level meetings and assemblies
 - Possible solutions: Cancel, conduct outdoors, or in one of our larger classrooms (same square footage as MPR)
 - Haunted Mansion (fall festival)
 - Possible solution: Conduct outdoors or find a different activity to raise money
 - Performing Arts events
 - Possible solutions: Use one of our larger classrooms or use a venue here in the community
 - School Dances
 - Possible solutions: Outdoors or use a venue here in the community
 - PE during inclement weather
 - Possible solutions: PE to use teacher classrooms during their preps

— What are we doing to get to 340?

- Increasing the areas we can grow this year and in the future-TK/K, 3rd, 4th, and 6th
- Social Media posts and ads
- Fliers and info at local businesses
- Participation in Beaumont's Chamber of Commerce
- Promotional materials, including a video celebrating Highland Academy's 10-year anniversary (2013-2023)

- Looking Forward 23/24 and beyond
- Our elementary program would have 122 enrollment spots
 - 22 TK/K
 - 25 students each for:
 - 1st/2nd Combo, 3rd, 4th, and 5th
- Middle School would have <u>218 openings</u>:
 - 72/73 students per grade level; 3 sections of 24 students for each grade
